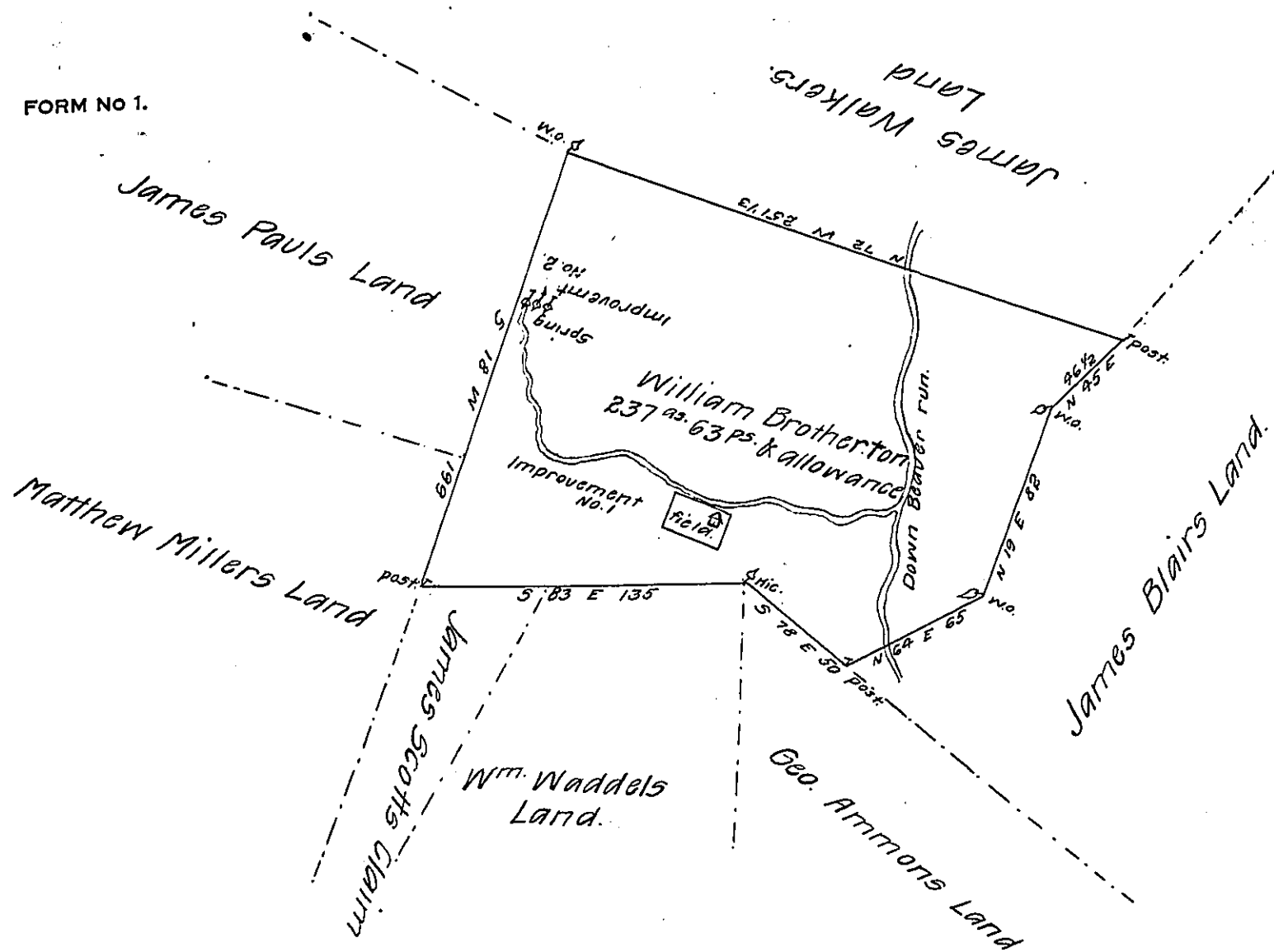


FORM NO 1.



In pursuance of a warrant dated Jan^y 3^d 1775 and in Obediance to an order from the Hon^{ble}. Board of Property dated June 2nd 1794 there was survey'd for William Brotherton the above described tract of land containing two hundred and thirty seven acres and 63 perches with an allowance proportioned to six p. Cent Situate in the township of Washington in the County of Westmoreland Survey'd Nov^r 14th 1795.

N.B. No 1. a good Cabin Built and three or four acres of land cleared and fenced and Indian corn & Potatoes raised by Alex^r. Thompson in the year 1773 and it is said sold by him to Jacob Thompson I do not understand that any person lived on the land from that time to the present day Jacob Thompson by his warrant intended to join Ja^s. Chambers but was prevented by James Walker and Geo. Hutchenson they both having surveys between his improvement and Chambers; Jacob Thompson procured a survey to be made on the above described tract of land on the 15th of May 1789 and the return delivered to him to carry to the Surv^r. Gen^l's Office I do not remember that Mr. Brotherton or any person for him applied to me to have a survey made until about a year ago when the Army was in this country.
