



A Draught of a survey called the "Buffaloe Lick" lying on the waters of Cross Ck. in Washington County cont<sup>g</sup> 300 Ac<sup>s</sup> 22 Ps. strict Measure executed Decem<sup>r</sup>. 24th. 1785 in consequence of a Certif<sup>e</sup> for 400 Ac<sup>s</sup> granted to Richd Wells, Junr. by the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> appointed by Virginia to adjust the Titles to unpatented Lands in the Counties of Mon<sup>g</sup>, Yoh<sup>g</sup> and Ohio and duly entered with the County Surv<sup>r</sup> as appears from the List of Entries transmitted from the Surv<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>ls</sup> Office.
