



A Draft of a Tract of Land situate in Fannet Township in the County of Franklin (formerly in the County of Cumberland) Containing Ninety one Acres and 117 Perches and an Allowance proportional to Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent (of 100) Roads &c? Resurvey'd March 27th 1793 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to John Watson bearing Date the 8th Day of Sept^r 1755.

N.B. The Warrant above referred to is not in my Hand. William McIntire Assignee of John Watson has not furnished me with it, but says it is in his possession and has showed me an original rough Draft of a Survey made by W^m Lyon (a former Assistant to Gen^l Armstrong) for said Watson, of 91^a & 103 $\frac{1}{2}$ #. The Survey has, however undergone an Alteration by a resurvey made by Samuel Lyon (another Assistant of the same Gentleman) at the Instance of W^m McIntire, in the year 1767, the lines of which have been by me more generally followed than that of William Lyon's and the quantity struck off for this Warrant made nearly equal to that of the original Survey.

There is at present no Dispute known to me respecting this Part of McIntires Land as now survey'd
