Surveyed the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July 1777 by Charles Lukens the then deputy Surveyor of the district for Saml. Morris by virtue of his order of Survey bearing date the 3<sup>d</sup> day of April 1769. & N<sup>o</sup>. 1403. which will appear by the original draft remaining in my office at Sunbury & Surveyed by me on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of Novem<sup>r</sup>. 1792 by virtue of the above recited order agreeable to the old lines. Containing three hundred fifty Seven Acres & one hundred & thirty one perches & Allow<sup>e</sup>. ~
