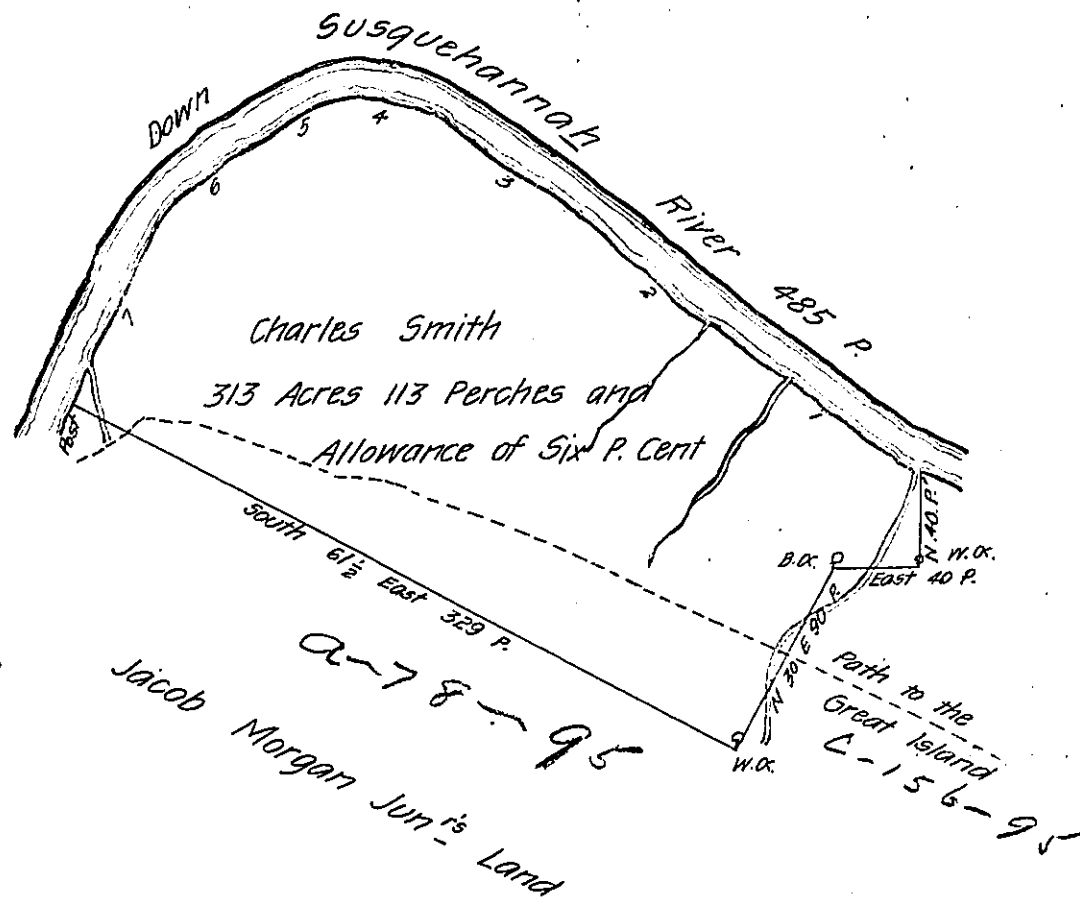

The above is the draught of a Tract of land formerly called, and hereafter to be known by the name of Chingleclamouch, adjoining and below the old Town of that name surveyed for Jacob Morgan about a mile above the Mouth of Clearfield Creek on the South Side of the West-Branch of Susquehanna River in Cumberland County containing three hundred and thirteen acres, one Hundred and thirteen Perches and the usual allowance of six P. Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 10th day of July 1769 for Charles Smith in pursuance of an Order No 2449 dated April the 3^d 1769
