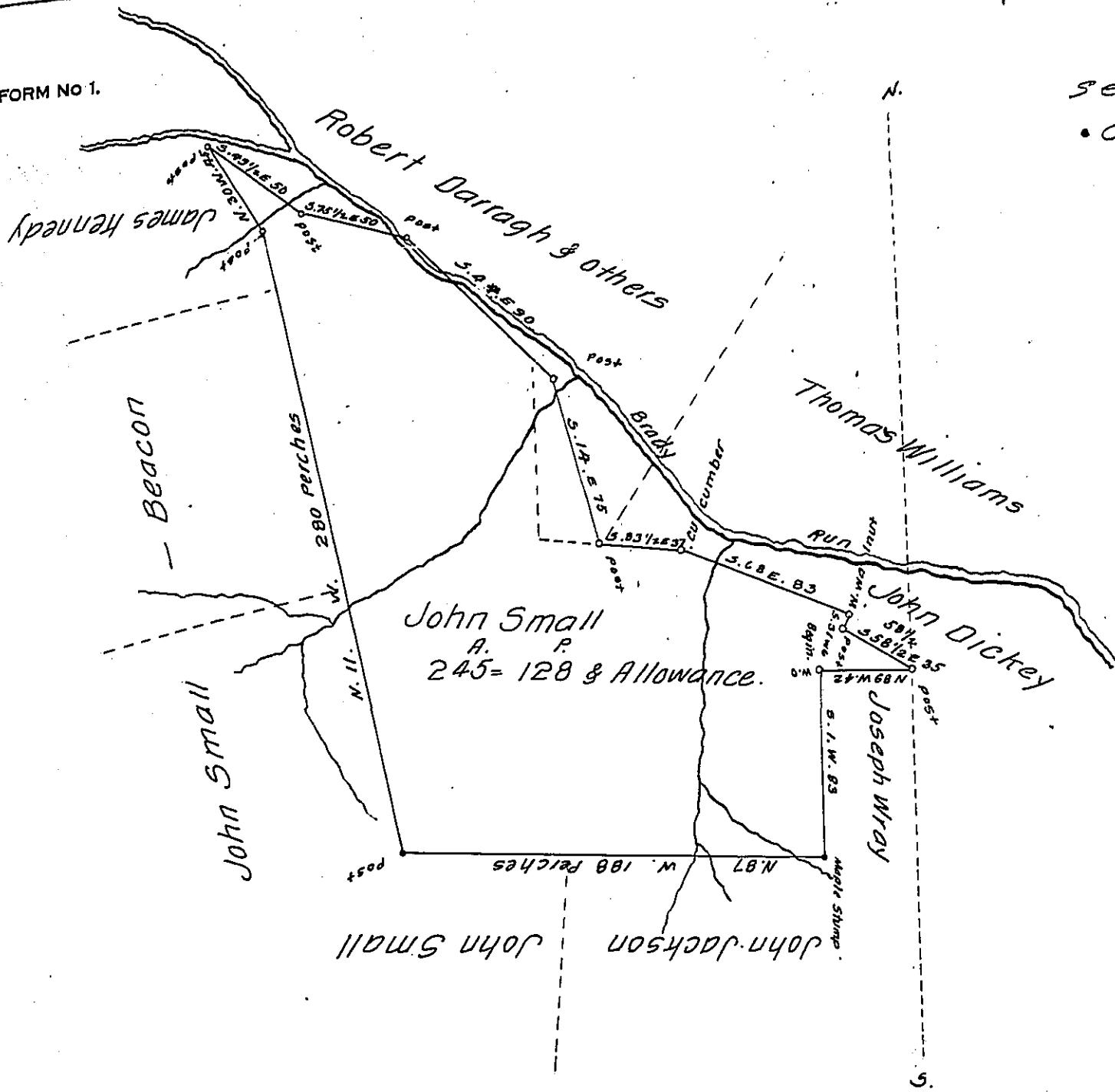

The above Draught represents a tract of land Surveyed January 6<sup>th</sup> 1838 for John Small in pursuance of his Actual Settlement and improvement - Situate in Brighton Township Beaver County Pa (North of the Ohio River.) Adjoining lands as Above. - Containing Two hundred and forty-five acres. One hundred and twenty eight perches, and Allowance of Six per cent.
