



The Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in East Pennsborough Township Cumberland County Containing Fifty one Acres and 25 Perches and Allowance of Six & Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed October 6th 1792 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Thomas Tremble Dated August 4th 1792.

Note. That part within the dotted line was taken into Tremble's Survey at first, but the quantity being too large for his Warrant it was struck off. being chiefly Improved land. and Claimed by Samuel Calhoon's Heirs. but there still remains part of Calhoon's Improvements within Trembles Survey, which is said to ^{be} made upwards of twenty five years since - The part struck off Contains 14 Acres and 144 perches & Allowance. the whole amounting to 66 Acres & Allowance.
