Containing Two hundred and Sixty Seven acres and one hundred and forty five perches and the Usual allowance of Six p. Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 20th Day of February 1766 for John Wilson. In pursuance of a Warrant dated the 20th Day of September 1762. p.
