



Situate on the West side of the East Branch of the Standing Stone Creek, at the South West end of the Brushy Ridge in the Township of Barree & County of Huntingdon, Containing Fifty four Acres, One Hundred & one perches & the Usual Allowance of Six pr.Ct. for Roads, &c. Surveyed the Twenty Sixth day of February, 1793, In pursuance of a Warrant to Samuel Davis, dated the Forth day of January, 1793, with Interest payable from the first of March, 1775, for 50 A<sup>cs</sup>.
