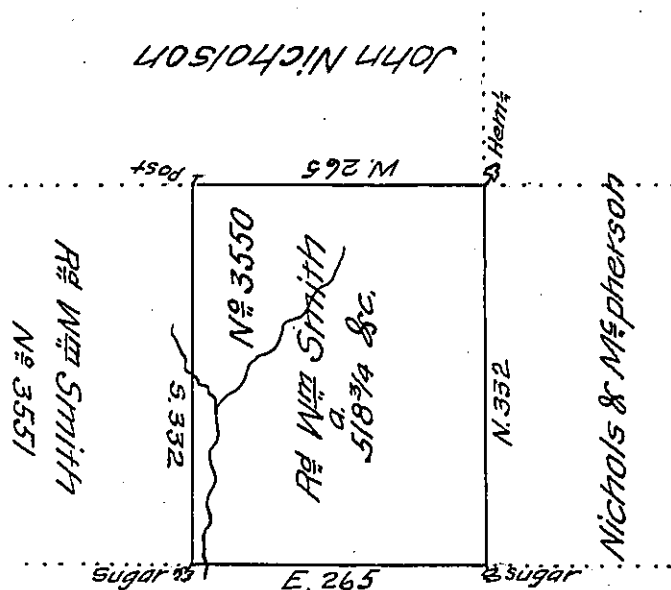

By virtue of a warrant dated the twenty-first Day of December one thousand seven hundred and ninety-two No 3550 there was surveyed on the twentieth Day of July A.D. 1793 unto the Reverend William Smith the above described tract of five hundred and eighteen acres and three-quarters of an acre situate on the waters of Tobys Creek, now Jefferson County in the last purchase district No 5.

Note, the return of the above survey was delivered by me to John Barron on or about the 27th Day of August 1793, he being then Chief Clerk of the Surveyor General's office, but it appearing that the same is not to be found filed in said office, a demand was made upon me by the commissioners appointed under the Act entitled an Act for the more speedy and effectual collection of certain Debts due to this Commonwealth, in pursuance of the sixth section of the supplement to the said Act, passed March 19th 1807, to make return of the same, John Nicholson being interested in the same.

William P. Brady being duly sworn according to Law, doth declare & say, that he made the survey as above returned, and that the facts above set forth are true.
