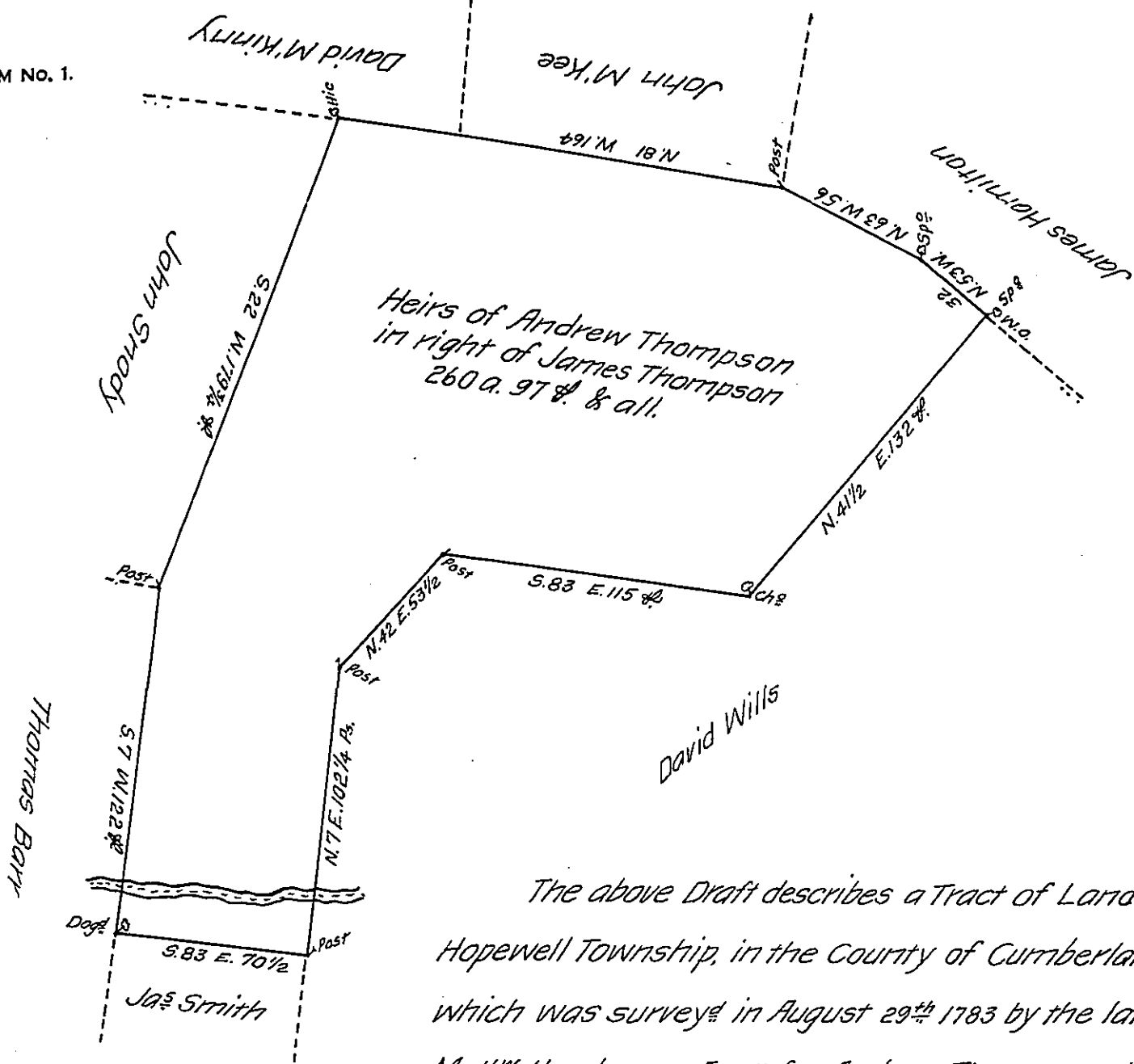

The above Draft describes a Tract of Land in Hopewell Township, in the County of Cumberland, which was surveyed in August 29<sup>th</sup> 1783 by the late Matt<sup>r</sup> Henderson, Esq<sup>r</sup>, for Andrew Thompson, but

I do not find that said Survey was an official one—said Thompson is since dead, and has directed the Executors to sell the land in divisions & at different times for the use of his Children—The Guardians of whom alledge they would be thereby injured and wish to reach the Title so as to sell the whole together, and have taken a warrant in the name of James Thompson Dated 20<sup>th</sup> January 1797 which very exactly describes the ground—but said James Thompson has no Improvement there as set forth in his warrant—he is a stranger nor does he now pretend to claim the same for himself—The land has been Improved more than thirty years—The warrant being taken at 50<sup>¢</sup> \$ 100 acres—and the singular use that seems intended thereby made the above statement appear necessary—it was Surveyed after said warrant was put in my hands on the 28<sup>th</sup> February 1797 and Contains two hundred and Sixty Acres 97 Perches and allowance of Six & Cert. &c<sup>o</sup>
