



Situate on the North west side of "Ravers gap" where the road from Woodcock valley passes through Tusseys mountain in Liberty township Bedford County, Containing 43 acres 84 perches & allowance of 6 per cent for roads &c. Surveyed by Saml. Ketterman Esq the 26<sup>th</sup> of January 1853, in pursuance of a warrant granted to John B. Dilling for 50 acres dated the 7<sup>th</sup> of Jan<sup>y</sup>. 1853.
