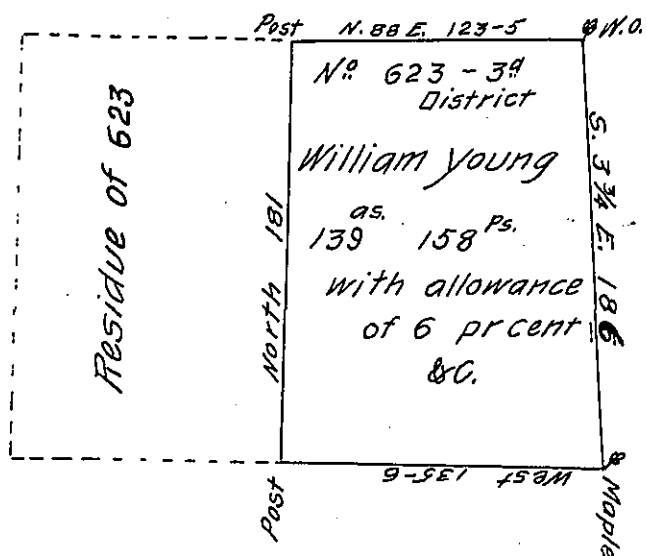

The above is a draft of the east end of Donation lot No 623 in the third district of Donation Land which appears an undrawn tract. Situate in Lachawanack Township Mercer County, containing one hundred and thirty-nine acres and 158 perches with the usual allowance of six per cent & C. Surveyed according to the original lines (except the division line) this twelfth day of January 1824 in pursuance of an actual settlement and improvement made thereon, and upon this tract William Young is now residing with his family and engaged in cultivating the same.

Improvements are a Cabben house, Barn and not less than twenty acres cleared and cultivated. The residue of this tract is owned by a person who is not prepared to take out his title at present.

I believe there is no adverse claim to this tract, if it be undrawn.
