



A Draft of a tract of land Called Quaker Purchase situate on the Waters of Nanticoke Creek on the Southerly side of the North East Branch of Susquehanna River in the County of Northumberland, <sup>now Luzerne</sup> surveyed on the first day of August 1774 by Charles Stewart then deputy surveyor, in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 19<sup>th</sup> day of August 1773 to Mary Steel containing Three hundred twenty-six acres & three quarters to the allowance of Six & Cent for Roads &ca.
