



Situate in Tod-Township Huntingdon County about two miles from the Black  
 on the waters of Trough Creek  
 Hollow, containing two Hundred & ten acres & forty perches & allowance. Said to be  
 Surveyed Augt. the 14<sup>th</sup> 1785 on Warrent to Alexander M<sup>o</sup> Clelland dated the 24<sup>th</sup> of  
 August 1784. (then Containing 222<sup>ac</sup> & 40<sup>ps</sup>) Resurveyed the 14<sup>th</sup> day of September 1850  
 in pursuance of an order of Resurvey granted to Samuel Caldwell, <sup>the present owner</sup> by the Board of  
 property dated the 25<sup>th</sup> day of February 1850. authorising him to throw out Interfer-  
 ances & take in other Vacant land.
