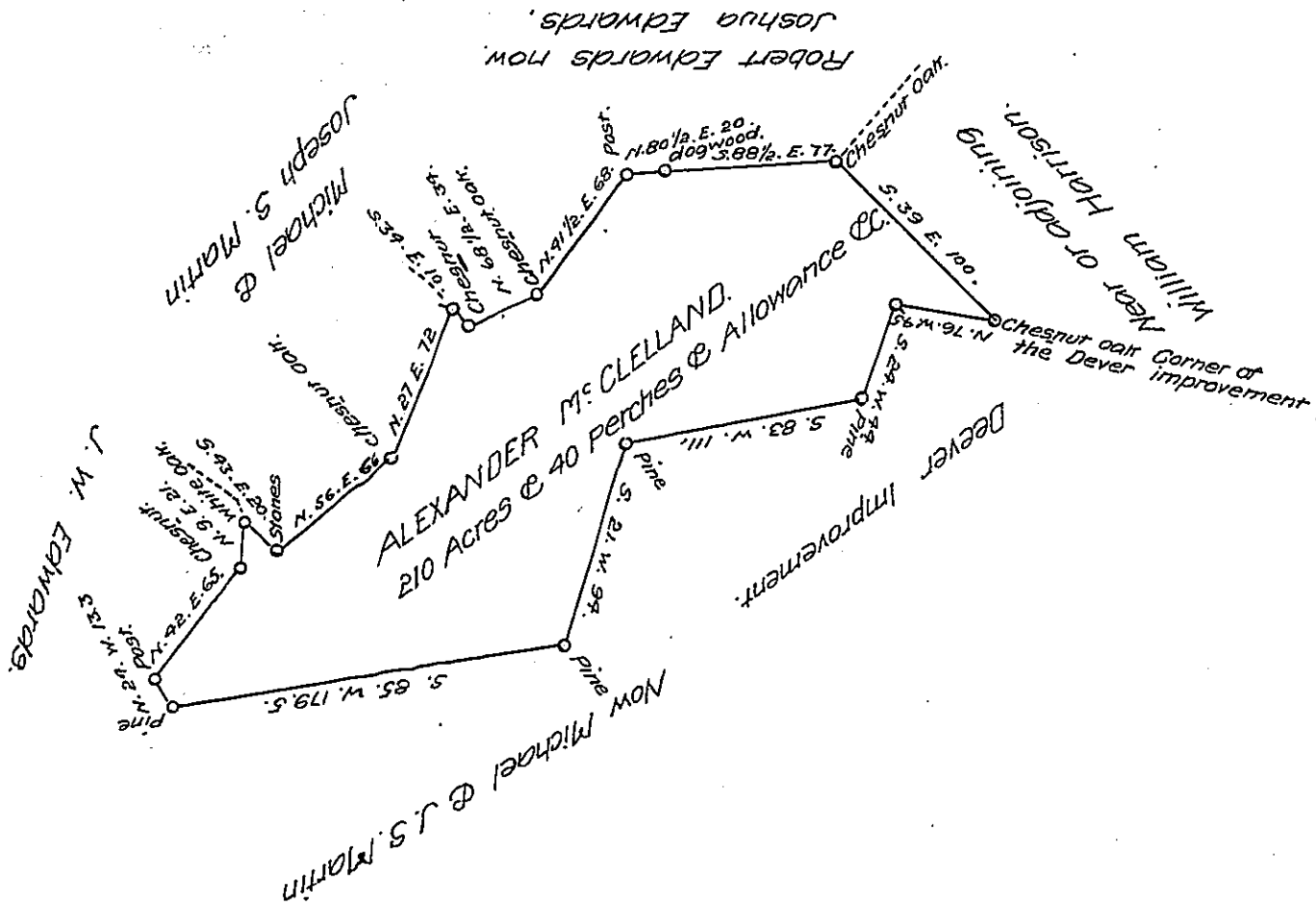

And first Surveyed August 14th 1785 in pursuance Of A warrant granted to Alexander M^r Clelland dated August 24th 1784 then Said to Contain 222 Acres & 40 Perches Resurveyed September 14th 1850 in pursuance Of An Order Of Resurvey granted to Samuel Caldwell the present Owner dated February 25th 1850 Authorizing the then deputy Surveyor to throw Out interferences And take in Vacant land &c. examined And Approved this the 29th July 1853.
