



## FIELD NOTES.

Beginning at the North West Corner of Warrant Number 1799, thence  $53\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W. 164 rods to a post thence  $3.86\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E. 105 rods to a post, thence  $N3\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E. 164 rods to a post in the North line of Said Warrant thence  $N86\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W. 105 rods to the place of beginning.

A draft of a tract of land situated in the township of Highland and County of Elk containing 101 acres and  $85\frac{1}{4}$  perches and allowance of Six percent for roads &c. Surveyed for H.O. Ellithorpe, D.C. Oyster, Alfred Short, C.R. Earley, Horace Little and H.M. Powers the 8<sup>th</sup> day of October 1885 it being a part of a larger tract of 1004 acres and allowance originally surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Thomas M. Willing dated August 18<sup>th</sup> 1792
