By virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners bearing date the 16th of the 12th month 1701 There was Survey'd on the sixth day of the second month 1702 unto George Harland two hundred acres of land in a Bend of Brandwine Creek in the Township of Birmingham in the County of Chester for which he has agreed to pay fifty pounds to the use of the Proprietary Beginning at a Poplar at a corner of Philip Romans land and by the side then up the same of Brandwine Creek, on Several Courses five hundred and eleven fches to the mouth of a Run Then up the same on ~~several~~ Courses one hundred sixty seven fches to a white oak by the said Run Then by the said Romans Land north Eighty degrees west One hundred forty seven fches to the Beginning.
