



By virtue of a Warrant to me Directed under the hand and Seal of Edward Penington Surveyor Gen^l bearing date the 4th day of ye 8th moneth 1701. I Survey'd to John Lea a certain Tract of Land situated in Concord in Chester County Begining at a wallnut tree standing in Concord Street being ye corner of John Mendenhall's Land. Thence west south west two degrees southward 498 perches to a white oak thence south south east two degrees eastward 44 perches to a black oak thence east nor east two degrees northward 498 perches to a post thence north north west two degrees west ward forty four perches to the place of begining Containing one hundred thirty six acres (and 152 perches)

Survey'd and Laid out the ninth day of the 8th moneth 1701.
