James Logan of the County of Chester complains that he having obtained a warrant for 300^{acs} of Land in Chester County dated the 9th of Feb. 1733 John Taylor in Pursuance thereof made a Survey for him in the Spring of the Year 1736 And that Elisha Gatchel & John Churchman have lately made a Survey for Jane Moor Widow — James Logan therefore enters this as a caveat against the confirmation of the Land surveyed to the s^d Jane Moor till he have a full hearing thereof.

By Acc^t from ~~fr~~ John Churchman I understand he has surveyd to Wid^e Moore a small piece adjoining to her other Land see the Draught she applied sever^{al} years ago to the Comm^{rs} and obtaind. their leave notwithstanding w^{ch} & James Logan afores^d ~~was~~ being acquainted therewith resolved against all order to improve thereon.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February 1833, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this seventeenth day of December, 1907.
