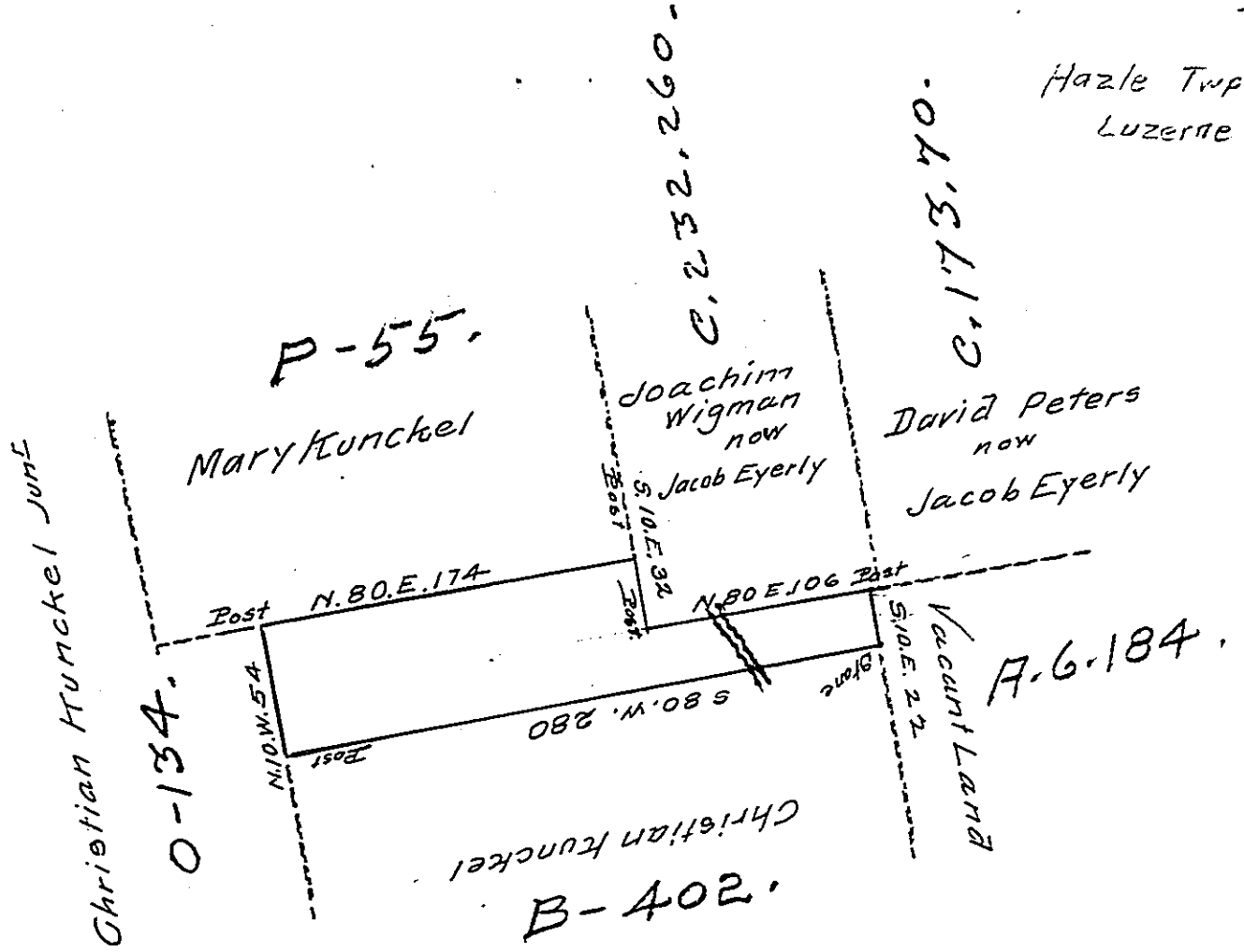


The Division line of 32 perches between Eyerly & Kunckel run agreeable to a agreement between them & Palmer
