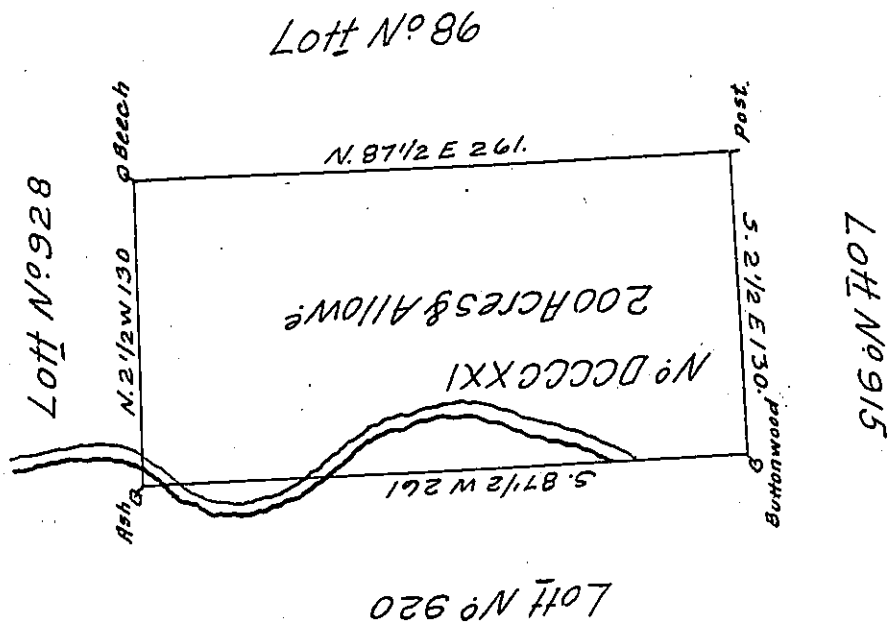


Received of James Trimble a patent for

In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania,  
 passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785, entitled an Act directing the Mode  
 of distributing the Donation Lands, promised the Troops of this Common-  
 wealth; and by Order of the Surveyor General, with the Approbation of the  
 Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Executive Council, I have Surveyed on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of October  
 1785, the above Discribed Tract of two Hundred Acres of Land & Allowance  
 of Six p<sup>r</sup> Cent for Roads &c. No DCCCXXI - Situate in District No 5 on the  
 West Side of the Alleghany River, in the County of Westmoreland.
