



Situate in East Brunswick township Schuylkill County containing 99 acres 42 perches & allowance of six per cent for Roads &c. Surveyed on the 25th & 26th days of March A. D. 1847 unto Charles Hammes by virtue of a warrant granted to him dated the 26th day of February A. D. 1847. By John S. Pulsifer D. S.

There are at present ten or twelve acres of land cleared & in fence. A small one story log house a stable & some apple, peach & cherry trees are on this tract. On comparing my survey with an official draft of a survey made by Henry Wanderslice in 1793, I am induced to believe that this same tract of land was at that time surveyed & appropriated to George Mummy. The present occupant Mr. Charles Hammes has as I am informed resided on and improved this tract for more than 21 years. This tract has also been recently surveyed in connection with an adjoining tract as a part of the estate of Abraham Berger decd. It appears also that a survey made by John Dreher in 1819 for John W. Roseberry then Deputy Surveyor interferes with this tract.
