



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785 entitled an Act for directing the mode of distributing the Donation Lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth; and by Order of the Surveyor General: with the Approbation of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Executive Council; I have Surveyed on the 2<sup>d</sup> day of October 1785 the above Discribed Tract of two Hundred Acres of Land and allowance of Six P. Cent for Roads & N<sup>o</sup> DCCCCXXV. Situate in District N<sup>o</sup> 5 on the west side of the Allegany River in the County of Westmoreland.
