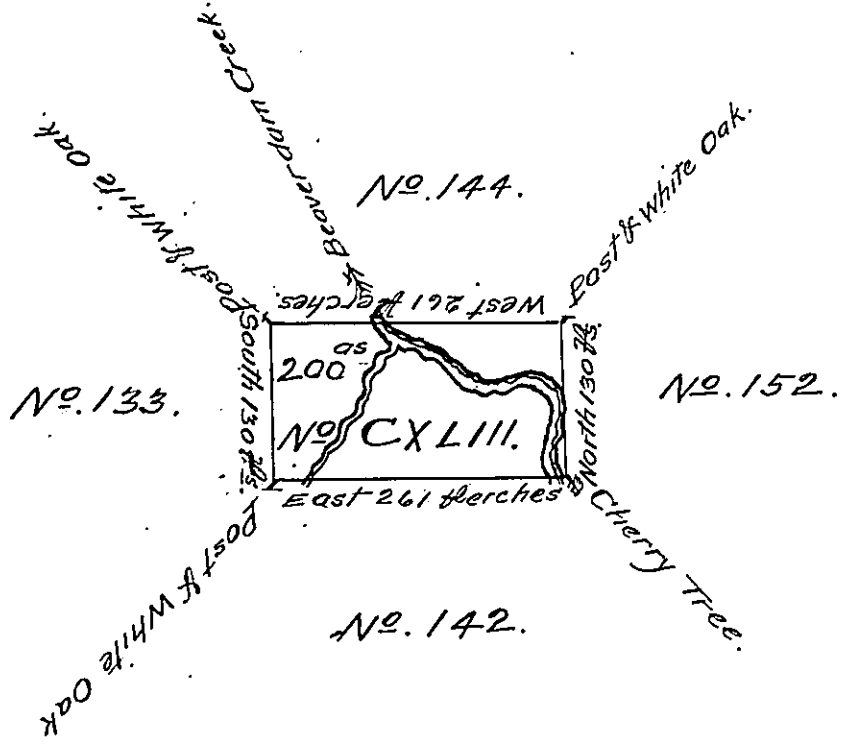

In pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785, entitled "An Act for directing the mode of distributing the donation lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth; and by order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the Honourable the Supreme Executive Council, I have surveyed on the Fourth day of <sup>November</sup> ~~October~~ 1785, the above-described Tract of Two Hundred acres of Land, and allowance of six per cent. for roads, &c. No. CXLIII. situate in District No. 1. on the west side of the Allegany river, in the County of Westmoreland.
