



The above Diagram represents the lines of four Tracts of Land situate in the Horse Valley Lettertenry Township Franklin County. Survey^d on the following Office rights. Viz. The red lined figure represents a Survey of 199 Acres. Surveyed 15th of August 1770. On an Order of Survey to Robert Wilkins dated 5 May 1769. N^o 5454 and returned as per. List. N^o 1. of unpatented Lands. That part of the Same lying S. West of the double lines (S. 46 1/2. E. 165) marked A. is covered by a Survey of 165 3/4. Acres on Warrant Granted William Fowler. dated 1 September 1787. And that part of the same lying N. E. of the double lines a/s^d marked B. is covered by two Surveys. Viz. one of 111 1/4 Acres on Warrant to W^m Clarke dated 25 ~~May~~ ^{August} 1786. the other of 70^a 60^{ps} on Warrant to Mary Clarke dated 5 April 1788.

Note. From the most careful examination of title papers & Office Draughts: the above is supposed to be the Local situation of the Robert Wilkins Tract together with the circumstance of Samuel Perry (who procured the Survey on Wilkins Order) being recognized as owning Land here.
