



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the state of Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785 entitled an Act for directing the mode of distributing the Donation Lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth and by Order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Executive Council I have surveyed on the 25 day of October 1785 the above discribed Tract of two hundred acres of Land & Allowance of Six p<sup>c</sup> Cent. for Roads &c Nº DCCX MXLVIII Situate in District Nº 5 on the West side of the Allegany River in the County of Westmoreland —

June 5<sup>th</sup> 1797 Received of James Trimble a patent in my name for lot Nº 1047 in 5<sup>th</sup> district in right of Samuel Crawford private Robert Porterfield —
