



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785 entitled an Act for directing the mode of distributing the Donation Lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth " and by order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Executive Council, I have Surveyed on the 9<sup>th</sup> day of October 1785 the above discribed Tract of two Hundred Acres of Land & allowance of Six p<sup>c</sup> Cent. for roads & N<sup>o</sup> MI. Situate in District N<sup>o</sup> 5 on the West side of the Allegany river in the County of Westmoreland.
