The green lines represent the draft of a tract of land surveyed for Rachel Warford in trust for the heirs of Joseph Warford decd on warrant dated the 1st day of January 1811. This tract interferes two hundred and thirty eight acres and one hundred and fifty nine perches with the Alexander Ross survey. William Russell entered the above location in the land office in the name of Alexander Ross and then conveyed to Joseph Warford whose widow obtained the aforesaid warrant and then conveyed with the other heirs of Joseph Warford to David Rowland Esqr, Joseph Graves and James Parsons who were also heirs of Joseph Warford, James Parsons devised his part to his heirs the present owners. David Rowland Esqr & Joseph Graves are the present owners of their respective parts.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this seventeenth day of July 1908.
