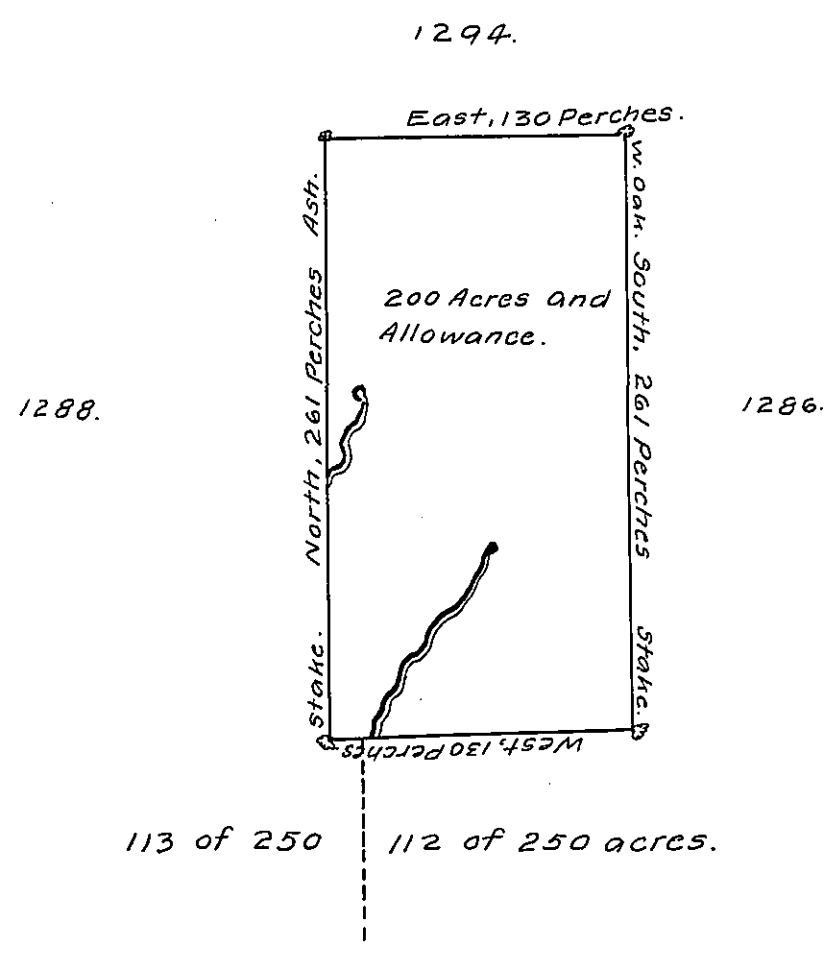


Donation-Land, in District N<sup>o</sup> 6.

In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania, passed the twenty-fourth Day of February 1785, intituled, 'An Act for directing the Mode of distributing the Donation-Lands promised to the Troops by this Commonwealth,' and by Order of the Surveyor General, with the Approbation of the Honourable the Executive-Council, I have surveyed, on the first Day of December 1785, the above described Tract of Two hundred Acres of Land, and Allowance of Six per Cent. for Roads, &c. No. 1287 situate in District No. 6, on the West Side of the Allegheny River, in the County of Westmoreland.
