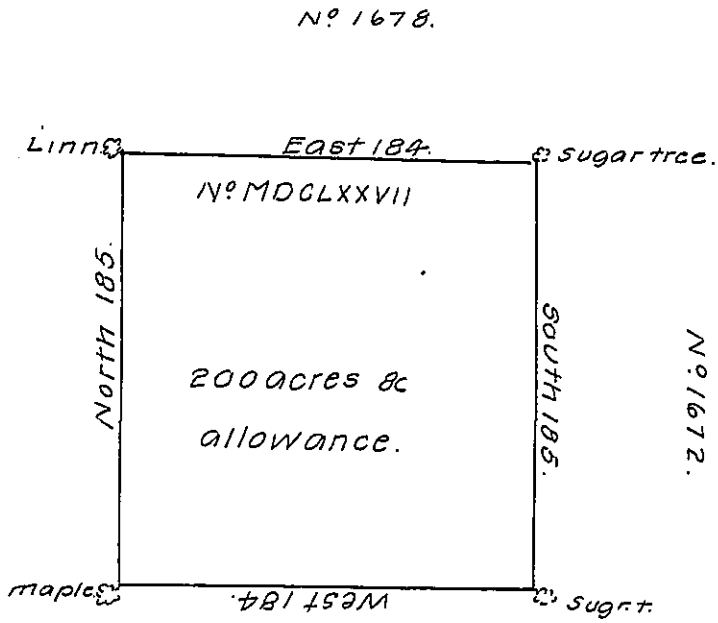

April 6th 1794 John McElwaine private soldier application made by Andrew Nelson June 20th 1793 Col: Cook paid the Surveying fees.

In pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the state of Pennsylvania, passed the 24th day of February, 1785, entitled "An Act for directing the mode of distributing the Donation Lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth"; and by order of the surveyor General with the Approbation of the Honourable the Supreme Executive Council, I have surveyed on the 25 day of October 1785, the above described tract of two hundred acres of land, and allowance of six per cent. for roads, &c. Nº 1677 situate in District Nº 8. on the west side of the Allegeny river, in the county of Westmoreland.
