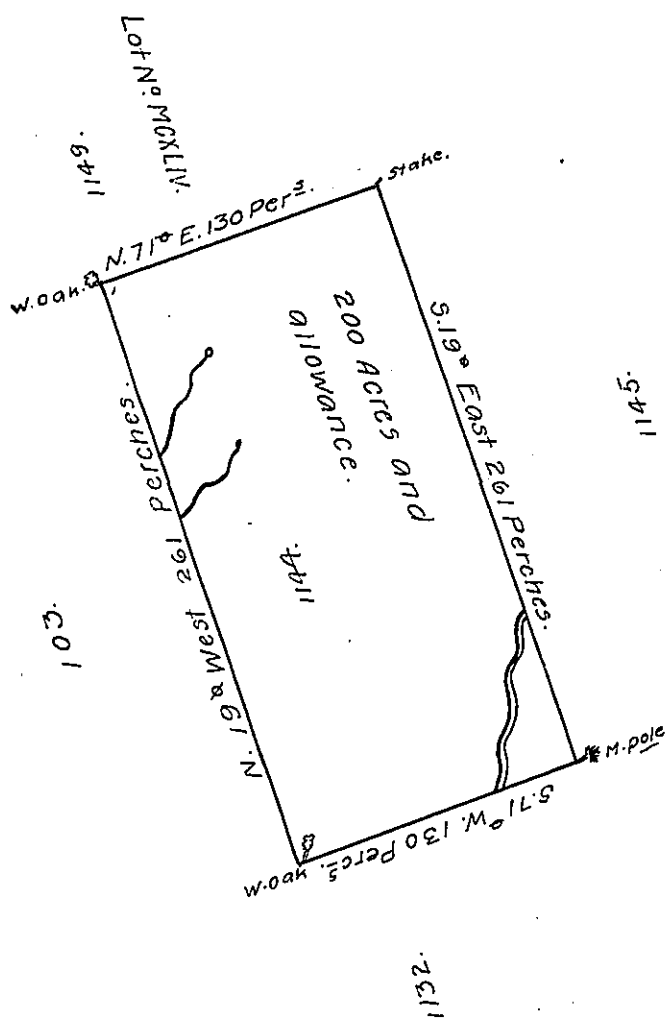


Donation land in District No 6.



In pursuance of an act of General assembly of the state of Pennsylvania, passed the twenty fourth day of February 1785, intituled 'An Act for directing the mode of distributing the donation lands promised to the Troops by this Common Wealth,' and by order of the Surveyor Genl. With the approbation of the Honourable the Executive Council, I have surveyed on the Tenth day of November 1785 the above discribed Tract of two hundred acres of land and allowance of six ~~perches~~ ^{perches} for roads &c. N^o 1144 Situate in district N^o 6 on the West side of the Allegheny river in the County of Westmoreland
