



In pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Penn<sup>a</sup> Passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785 entitled "an Act for directing the Mode of distributing the Donation Lands promised the Troops of this Commonwealth;" and by order of the Surveyor General with the Approbation of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Executive Council, I have survey'd on the 24<sup>th</sup> Day of September 1785, the above described Tract of two hundred Acres of Land and Allowance of Six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Ct for roads &c. No DCLIII situate in District No 4 on the West side of the Allegheny River in the County of Westmoreland.
