



In pursuance of an order of the Board of Property of Pennsylvania bearing date the 17<sup>th</sup> September 1805, I have Surveyed the above two tracts of land for James Ross Esquire the one containing 250 acres & 49 perches being the same tract that was surveyed for George Crochan by Robert McCrea D<sup>y</sup>. Sr in pursuance of an order No 20 & stated to contain 228<sup>a</sup> 82<sup>p</sup> in the general draft of the same survey - the other containing 103 acres 39 perches being part of the tract that was surveyed for James Caldwell in Pursuance of his warrant dated 26 November 1773 - Henry Haslet
