



The Shaded lines in the above diagram represent a Survey made to David Fullerton on the 3^d day of May 1774. By warrant of the 6th of April 1774 - is found to lie north of the purchase of 1768 except about 20 acres including the letter A in the above diagram which is clear of interference. The dotted lines in the above represent the Surveys in the purchase of 1784 the warrantee names dates &c are inserted in the drafts respectively there is no improvement within the lines of David Fullertons Survey. The land is now claimed under the new purchase titles. I could not find that any person claimed under the title of Fullerton. Situate part in Mahoning and part in Washing Township in the County of Indiana. The above interference ascertained the 12th day of May 1828 in pursuance of the Several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by Virtue of Locations or other Office titles issued from or under the Proprietary Government and by Authority from the Board of property
