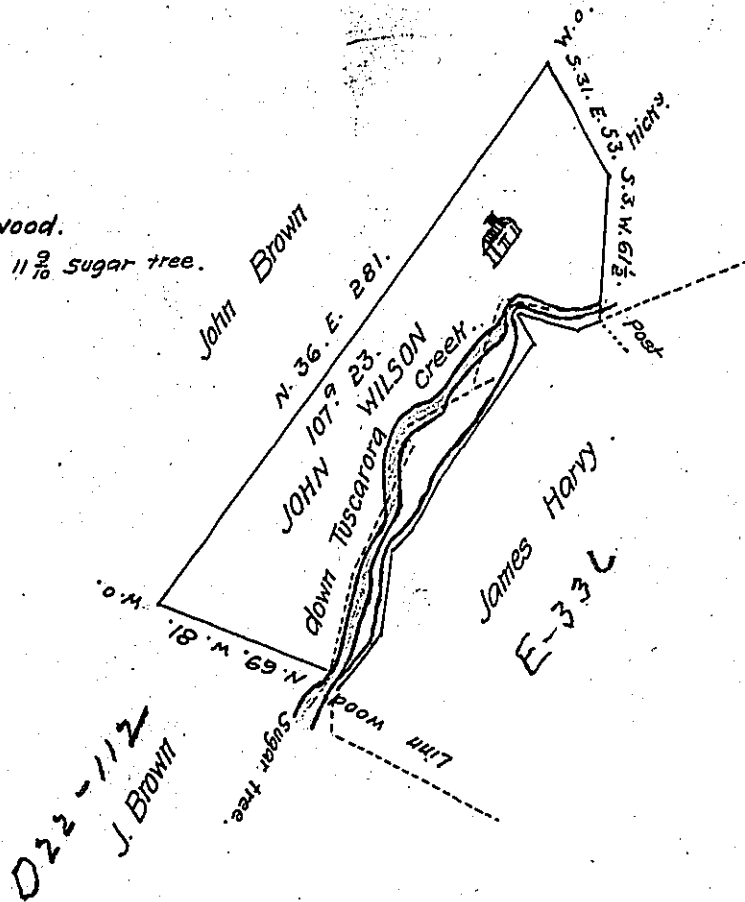

A Draught of one hundred and seven acres and twenty three perches of land with Six per  
cent for roads Situate in Lact township in Mifflin County, 96 acres of <sup>which</sup> appears to have been  
surveyed 2<sup>nd</sup> June 1767 and returned into the Surveyor Generals office in pursuance of an  
order of Survey to John Wilson dated 2<sup>nd</sup> December 1766 and numbered 2040, <sup>then in Cumberland County</sup> Resurveyed  
10<sup>th</sup> March 1810 and an addition made in pursuance of an Order of the Board of Property  
dated 3<sup>d</sup> January 1810. Note, the dotted lines which cross the creek, represent the Original  
Survey.
