



The tract N° 1 was surveyed in Pursuance of a  
 Warrant bearing date November 15<sup>th</sup> 1784 to Philip Cose Patd.  
 N° 2 was surveyed and returned on a warrant for George Henry. All patented  
 Graft Cose had owned or claimed the tract N° 2 but being a dissipated  
 wretch he sold his right to <sup>a</sup> Cheating George Henry for half a gallon of rum  
 and said Henry then ~~wanted it and~~ ~~was~~ obtained a warrant for it  
 warrant to Geo. Henry dated 15<sup>th</sup> March 1788 Patd. S.L.C.
