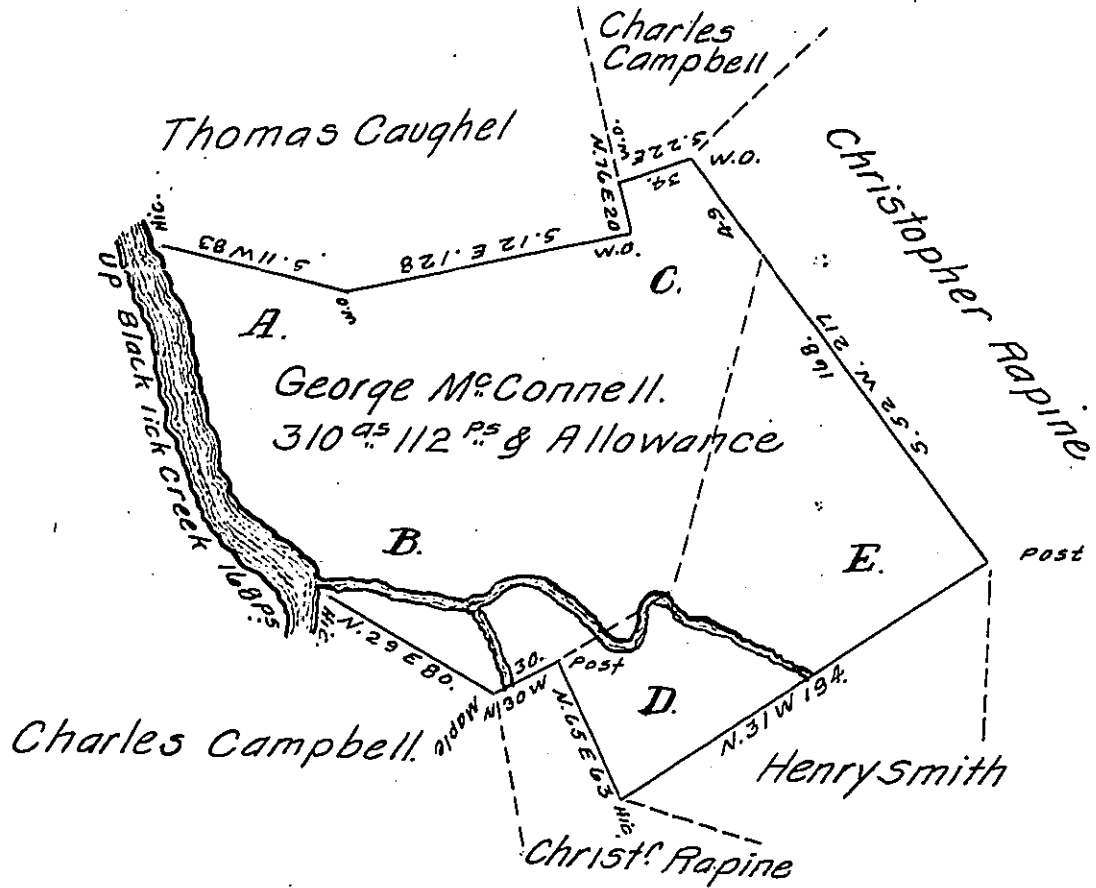

I have this 25th day of January 1828 Surveyed the ~~within~~ Above described tract of Three hundred and ten acres and One hundred and twelve perches and Allowance of Six per cent. Adjoining lands of Thomas Caughel, Christopher Rapine, Henry Smith and others. Situate on a run on the West Side of Black Lick Creek below where the path leading from Kittanning to Ligonier crosses said creek in the Township of Black Lick in the County of Indiana. By Virtue of a Location granted to George McConnell the 3^d of April 1763. N^o 50.
