Note) The above ~~the~~ land was Returned on an Application N<sup>o</sup> not to be granted found to Abraham Leshar whose heirs now hold it. Caruthers Claimed it and sent on his Application to the D. S. to have it laid on.—The Leasures and others prevented its execution forcibly. Caruthers Brought Suit against Leasure and had two decisions ~~in~~ against him from the board of property, and as often Renewed in the Court of ~~Quarter Session~~ <sup>Common Pleas</sup> of Westmoreland— by Leshes where he gained and the death of Caruthers shortly after put a stop to futher hostilities.
