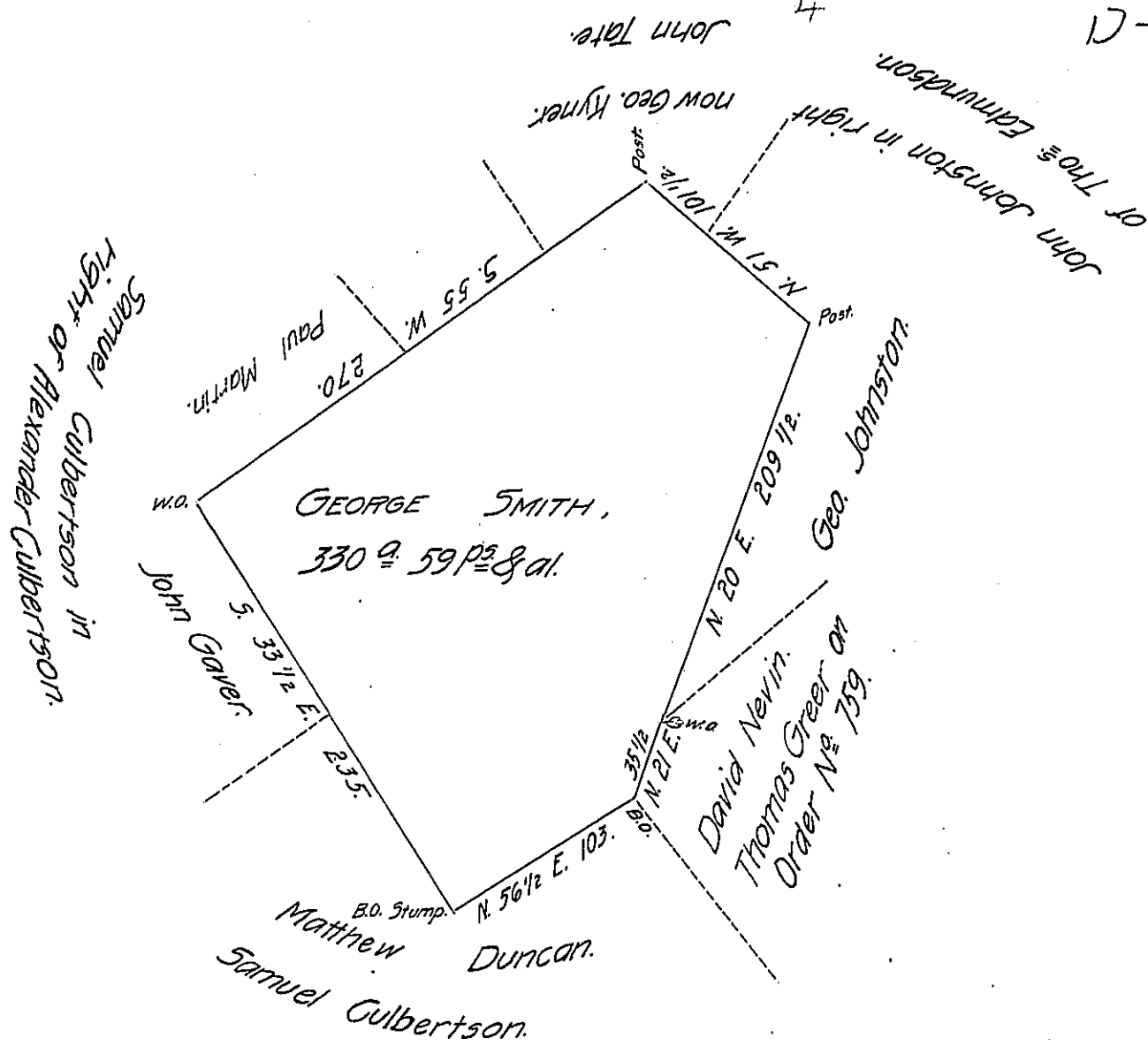

Draught of a Tract of Land situate part in Green & part in Southampton Townships, Franklin County, containing three hundred & thirty Acres & fifty nine perches & allowance of six per cent for Roads &c. Survey<sup>d</sup> 24 November, 1828, In pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented Lands under Proprietary Rights, &c. And by Virtue of an Order of Surky dated 2<sup>nd</sup> September, 1767, N<sup>o</sup> 4393, granted to George Smith for 300 Acres "bounded by John Johnston Thomas Greer, John Tate & Samuel Culbertson, in Letterkenny Township.

Report. The above Tract is wholly the same as a Tract purporting to be 285 Acres. Survey<sup>d</sup> 29 November, 1745, & returned to Land Office, no Warrant recited; but endorsed on the outside of the old Draft the name of Richard Peters; & in the inside the name Conrad Swartz, - Query as to the name of the Warrant. The Land having passed through the Sheriff's hands. I have not had access to the title papers; but it is presumed to be patented.
