



In pursuance of the authority of the Board of Property and of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary government. I have this 16<sup>th</sup> day of January 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of Two hundred and eleven acres and Allowance of Six per Cent on both sides of the South branch of Black lick creek below and adjoining land granted to George Irwin and adjoining William Brakin Alexander Wilson and others Situate in Wheatfield Township in the County of Indiana. By virtue of a warrant granted to Martha Irwin on the 20<sup>th</sup> October 1772.
