The dotted lines and the letters A B & C represent a Survey made to George Irwin the 16th Jan^y 1828 in pursuance of his Warr^t of the 20th Oct^r 1772 a return whereof is enclosed

The land was previously Surveyed to William Brakin on the 21st of May 1774 by Warr^t of the 13th Dece^r 1773 except that part embracing the letter C. I have laid down the draft of the Survey of Edward Fowlers claim. It is now owned by William Clarke who informed me that he bought the claim of Edw^d Fowler before the Revolutionary war and has since taken out the title in his own name. When I came upon the ground to make Irwins Survey I found that the land had been Surveyed to W^m Brakin I therefore pursued the lines of Brakins Survey with the exceptions shown by dotted lines on the diagram. Brakins Survey is owned and occupied by three different persons or families, to wit John Brakin Thomas Clarke and James Wakefeild but I have not heard of any one claiming under the title of George Irwin.
