



In pursuance of the authority of the Board of property and of the Several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other office titles issued from or under the proprietary Government I have this 10<sup>th</sup> day of January 1828 - Surveyed the above described tract of land containing Three hundred and seven acres and a half and allowance of Six per Cent adjoining lands of Daniel Williamson James M'Lain Samuel M'Cartney William Brown Jonas Gaul & John Beck Situate on a branch of Two lick Creek (now called Stony Run) about two miles North West of the Two lick, or two=licks, in Centre Township in the County of Indiana. By virtue of a warrant granted to William Kenly on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of February 1773.
