



A Draft of A Tract of Land Situate on the North East Side of Dunning's Creek & about one half mile therefrom in Bedford Township & County of Bedford Containing Two Hundred & thirty Eight Acres and allowance of six per Cent for Roads &c. Survey for Frederick Reiger the 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1828 on Warrant dated the 12<sup>th</sup> day of April 1771. James O'Connor D.S.

To Gabriel Heister Esq. S.G. No. 1. Represented partly by the dotted lines is a draft of A tract of Land Surveyed for Charles Reicher on Warrant dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of May 1763. This tract Interferes One Hundred and Seventy Seven Acres and one Hundred & four perches with the Frederick Reiger Survey. Charles Reicher's Interest therein was sold by the Sheriff of Cumberland County to William Henry who conveyed to John Witherspoon D.D. John Bayard and John Snowden. John Witherspoon Conveyed his part to John Bayard & John Snowden who conveyed to Frederick Reiger who obtained the afore described Warrant (and from whom Bayard & Snowden had gained the land at law.) Frederick Reiger devised the same to his heirs who conveyed to John Yontz the present owner.

No. 2 Represented partly by Lake Colored lines is a draft of A tract of Land surveyed for Conrad Winemiller on Warrant dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of May 1763 this tract Interferes Sixty Acres and Sixty Six perches with the Frederick Reiger tract. Conrad Winemiller conveyed to John Witherspoon D.D. John Bayard & John Snowden. John Witherspoon conveyed to Bayard & Snowden who gained the Interference from Frederick Reiger at Law and then conveyed the same to him. Frederick Reiger Devised the same to His heirs who conveyed to John Yontz the present owner.
