In pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to unpatented lands under proprietary rights &c And by virtue of an order of survey dated 24 July 1767 No. 4218 granted to Henderson Hervey for 150 acres "joining William Herveys improvement between it and the Tuscarora Mountain in Fannet township.

Report.

The figures marked A & B represent the survey as made 20th November 1767 on the above mentioned order leaving out the figure marked C, which is now included & where the Mansion lies - for which part C a warrant was granted to Henderson Harvey for 20 acres dated 19th Sept 1791 and survey made as per official draft in office.

The figure B is cut off and held with the figure D, by the owner of a warrant granted to William Harvey dated 8 Sept 1755. Leaving but 106 acres 140 perches clear of any conflict.
