



Draft of a tract of land in Antrim township Franklin County containing sixty one acres & allowance of six per cent for roads &c surveyed the 27<sup>th</sup> of November 1829 (agreeable to lines formerly run by Matthew Henderson, Esq<sup>r</sup> formerly D.S. on a warrant granted David Magaw for 50<sup>acs</sup> of land an addition to his other land joining John Potter along the Magaw road in Antrim township dated the 11<sup>th</sup> of August 1752) in pursuance of a contract with the Board of property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to proprietary rights &c.
