



Draft of a tract of land situate in Antrim township Franklin County containing twenty six acres eighty four perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. surveyed the 25<sup>th</sup> of December 1829 (on an application granted James Cross for 100 acs of land on Rush Run joining Richard Gabriel & David Kennedy in Antrim township dated the 6<sup>th</sup> of January 1768 No. 4674) in pursuance of a contract with the Board of property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to proprietary rights &c.
