



Draught of a tract of land situate in Fannet township Franklin County, containing one hundred and ninety three Acres & allowance of six per cent for roads and  $\frac{1}{2}$  surveyed 29<sup>th</sup> October 1829, in pursuance of a contract with the Board of Property for ascertaining surveying and returning unpatented lands under Proprietary rights &c, and by virtue of a warrant dated 15<sup>th</sup> March 1763 granted to James Moore for 200 acres including Rober Wilsons improvement joining John Potts and John Matthews on Cocacheague Creek in Fannet township.

 The above described tract is wholly the same as a tract of 190 A± 56 perches surveyed 4 June 1763 on a warrant to William Wilson dated 7<sup>th</sup> day of March 1763 and held under said title, Wilson being eight days prior to Moore in obtaining his warrant. The above land is owned and occupied in part by James Dougal & part by Geo. Piper the balance by Mary Porter, unoccupied.
