



Situate in Hartslog Valley in Porter township Huntingdon County containing two hundred and eighty six & one half acres and allowance. Surveyed for William Piper on warrant dated the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of July 1766. Daniel Africa, D.S.

To Jacob Spangler, Esqr S.E.

The red lines represent the draught of a tract of land surveyed for William Piper, on warrant dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of September 1762, this tract interferes two hundred and eighty six & one half acres with the William Piper survey William Piper conveyed to D<sup>r</sup> William Smith who obtained the warrant in the name of William Piper, dated the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of July 1766. William Smith devised the same to Richard Smith and Charles Goldsborough. Charles Goldsborough conveyed to William Robb the present owner. The Sheriff of Huntingdon County sold the interest of Richard Smith to the President, Directors & Company of the Huntingdon Bank who are the present owners.

No warrant entered of the above date, to W<sup>m</sup> Piper.
