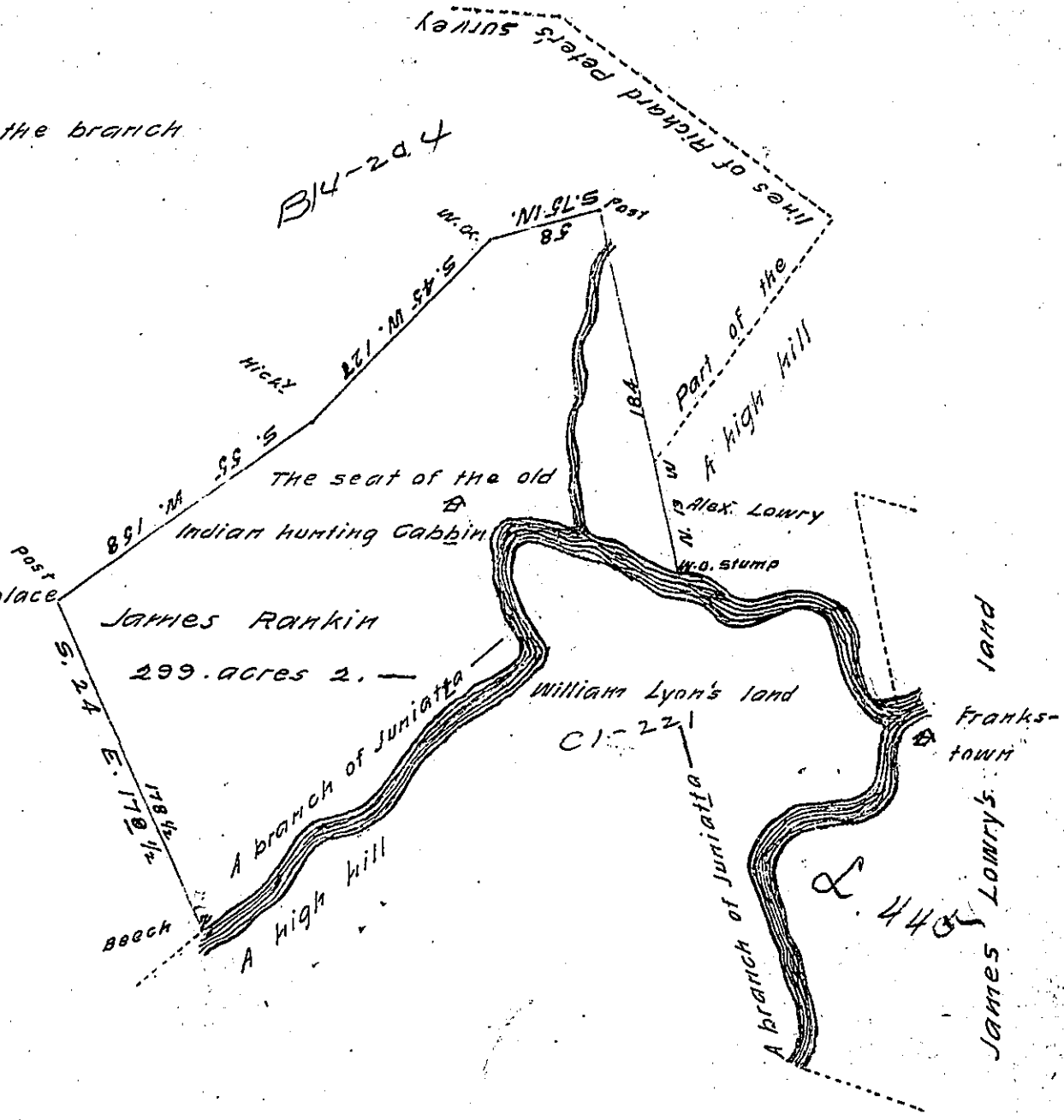

 cent. for roads &c. Surveyed for James Rankin August the 4th 1787 in
 pursuance of a warrant dated Feb^y the 3^d 1755 agreeable to the descrip-
 tion thereof & the evidence of Alexander Lowry, except where said de-
 scription & evidence were contradictory. There was also present the
 deposition of James Lindey, which corroborates the evidence of Alex. Lowry.
